1 YEAR OF ACTIVITY IN A NUTSHELL

Following its award in July 2014, the network of six Universities – lead by the <u>Università degli Studi di Milano (Italy)</u> – has started to pursue its objective, such as "encouraging the diffusion of innovative approaches, applied research and policy debate on services of general interest in the European Union from a citizens' perspective".

In particular, from *September 1st 2014 to August 31st 2015*, the network has undertaken and supported the following activities:

- ✓ Overall 10 seminars (out of 45 ones planned over three years of activity) have been organized. Amongst the topics discussed, there are, for instance, the role of the public auditing in the public enterprises, the water remunicipalisation as a new form of public service delivery, the liberalization and its effect on the firms, the governance of the State-Owned Enterprises in the multi-level system of the EU.
- ✓ On June 25th and 26th 2015, the EUsers organized the first of the two *workshops* scheduled in the framework of its project's activity. The workshop titled "<u>Major Public Enterprises in a global perspective</u>" was held as the Milan European XIV Milan European Economy Workshop and was organized in collaboration with <u>CIRIEC</u>.
- ✓ The *website* of the EUsers network has been launched on January 2015.
- ✓ A pilot *teaching experience* has been carried out at the Università degli Studi di Milano (IT). In particular, a new course (master level) in 'European regulatory economics' (ERE) has been organized (January-March, 2015).

- ✓ Two *Coordination meetings* have been organized, both at the Università degli Studi di Milano (IT) on October 23rd 2014 and June 24th 2015, respectively.
- ✓ Three *meetings were held with the EACEA officers*: in Milan on November 25th 2014; in Brussels on 22nd January 2015; In Brussels on July 9th 2015.
- ✓ The first <u>EUsers newsletter</u> has been issued on April 2015. It summaries six months of activities of the network.



XIV MILAN EUROPEAN ECONOMY WORKSHOP

Major Public Enterprises in a global perspective 25-26th of June 2015

The EUsers network, in collaboration with <u>CIRIEC</u> and the <u>Department of Economics</u>, <u>Management and Quantitative Methods</u> (DEMM) of the University of Milan, has organised the <u>XIV edition of the Milan European Economy Workshop</u>.

The workshop presented a preliminary knowledge developed within the EUsers Network on the empirical different analysis of the provision modes, with a specific focus on public providers. The workshop was structured according to an analysis of key research questions

The workshop took the form of an in-depth discussion of a set of invited papers by countries.

Country papers discussed include *European countries* (e.g. France, Germany, Ireland, Finland, Greece, etc.), *Chinese market*, *Asian countries* (e.g. Japan and India), *Americas* (e.g. Uruguay, Canada, Brazil, Chile) and *other Mediterranean countries* (e.g. Algeria, Turkey).



The first day of the workshop focused on the contributions from the European countries.

Amongst the speakers and institutions involved, there are: Thomas Kostal (WU Wirtschaftsuniversität Wien, Austria), Iohan Willner (Åbo Akademi University School of Business and Economics, Finland), Manto Lampropoulou (University of Athens, Greece), Stefano Clò (University of Milan, Italy), Catríona Cahill (University Limerick, Ireland), Stephanie Warm (Helmut-Schidt University, Germany), Lethbridge Jane (University of Greenwich, UK), Carole Rentsch (EPF Lausanne, Switzerland), Anto Bajo (University of Zagreb, Croatia), Valdone Darskuviene (Vytautas Lithuania), Magnus University, Marina Klinova (IMEMO, Russia).



Lars-Erik Fredriksson (Chair OECD Working Party on State Ownership and Privatization Practices) was invited as key-note speaker during the first day of the workshop. He discussed about the OECD interest in State-Owned Enterprises (guidelines and major changes) and focused on the activities and trends of the State Owned Enterprises operating in the global market.



The second day of the workshop was opened by the contribution of the key-note speaker *Richard Kozul-Wright* (UNCTAD) who focused on the lessons drawn from the revival of the industrial policy.

Then, Andrea Goldstein (OECD) and Yingchao Zhang (University of Vienna) discussed about the Chinese State-Owned Enterprises and the international market.

Contributions from Asia were provided by *Sofi Dinesh* (Amrita School of Business, India) and *Munenori Nomura* (Kwansei Gakuin University, Japan).

The final two sessions of the workshop focused contributions from Americas and some Mediterranean countries. Speakers and institutions involved include: Luc Bernier (Enap - Québec, Canada), Hugo Consciência Silvestre (UNILAB, Campus de Liberdade, Brazil), Francisco Castaneda (University of Santiago de Chile. Chile), Magdalena Bertino (Universidad de la República, Uruguay), Malika Ahmed Zaïd (University Mouloud Mammeri, Algeria), Sureyya Burcu Avci (Özyegin University).

Prof. Massimo Florio (Università degli Studi di Milano, IT) moderated the discussion during the two days. A final roundtable involving members of the EUsers network and CIRIEC closed the workshop.

This special issue is edited by members of the EUsers network (Massimo Florio - Università degli Studi di Milano - and Johan Willner - Åbo Akademi University School of Business and Economics) and the CIRIEC network (Luc Bernier, Enap - Québec).

The international journal of "Annals of Public and Cooperative Economics" has also expressed an interest to publish a special issue on papers presented at the XIV Milan European Economy Workshop.

TEACHING ACTIVITIES

EUsers Summer School on Public vs private provision of energy, telecoms, Transport and water Services

June 27th to July 1st 2016

Members of the EUsers network are currently working on the organization of the EUsers summer school on "Public vs private provision of energy, telecoms, Transport and water Services". The school will be held from June 27th to July 1st 2016 in Milan (IT).

It will target no more than 30 master-level and PhD students as well as young professionals, who are working in the fields of Economics, Public Economics, Social Studies, Political Science.

The school will have an international dimension, including participants selected from different countries (both within and outside the EUsers Network participating universities).

Students will be exposed to ongoing research, which is being disseminated by the EUsers Network.

Training activities will rely on a combination of face-to-face lectures (in the morning) and hands on sessions (in the afternoon).

After the closure of the morning sessions, participants will work in groups, which will be created around a common theme. Instructors will help in identifying, for each theme, the gaps in the literature, the areas for further research, both theoretical and applied.

Applications for the school will be possible until April 30th 2016.

Admission to the School will follow a selection process based on CV evaluation, reference letter and motivation. Applicants should provide evidence of their interest in the topic of services of general interest, should possess a good command of English and knowledge of economics or public administration and related topics.

Milan Summer School on Cost Benefit Analysis of Investment Projects

8-11th of September 2015

As part of its teaching activities, the EUsers network, in particular the team of the Università degli Studi di Milano, has participated in the organization of the summer school "Cost Benefit Analysis of Investment Projects: The new Programming Period 2014-2020" held in Milan from 8-11 September 2015. The School focused on the ex-ante appraisal (Cost Benefit Analysis) of Major Projects (whose costs exceed EUR 50 million) asking for co-financing under the European Structural and Investment Funds in the Programming Period 2014-2020.

The School targeted a wide range of users, including desk officers in the European Commission, civil servants in the Member States and in Candidate Countries, staff of financial institutions, consultants and practitioners involved in the preparation or appraisal of investment projects, young researchers and students. It has been designed for professionals and researchers who are dealing with the programme and project management of the EU Funds and for decision-makers of major projects in the fields of transport, environment, energy and telecommunications, research, and urban development.

Indeed, major projects analysed and discussed during the School were infrastructures delivering services of general (economic) interests, such as transport, energy, water supply, waste water treatment, etc. This summer school was at its fifth edition and was attended by more than 30 young professionals and students from different countries (not only European countries). The origin and working experiences of participants ranged from countries such as Belgium, Bulgaria, Lithuania, Italia, Czech Republic, Croatia, France, Latvia, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Saudi Arabia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain and UK.

Apart from traditional training methods, used during the first half of the training (face-to-face presentations) an interactive and practical approach was applied. After the closure of the morning sessions, participants worked in groups (they were divided in six groups) and practiced on how to assess a project by reviewing an evaluation report and how to actually carry out a cost-benefit analysis.



EUSERS MEETING

The 2nd EUsers coordination meeting 24th June 2015

The *second Coordination Meeting* took place on June 24th 2015 and was focused on four specific issues, such as i) the revision of the EUsers' budget, ii) the update of seminars' programme; iii) the organization of the summer school; iv) the publication of a handbook on public enterprises in collaboration with the CIRIEC network.

In particular, a reallocation of resources amongst categories of expenditures discussed and approved by each partner.

This revision was deemed necessary to ensure a smooth implementation of the project based on the successful experience of the first year of implementation. While a new structure of the budget was drafted, the total budget and the EU grant requested was not changed.

Also, they agreed to organize the summer school between June 27th and July 1st 2016 and to select papers, as outputs of EUsers seminars and workshops, to be published in a book on public enterprises in collaboration with CIRIEC network.

The next EUSers Coordination meeting is scheduled in June 2016 in Milan during the EUSers summer school on Public vs private provision of energy, telecoms, Transport and water Services.
