Sources: Providers' websites, Pinsent-Mason water yearbook, PSIRU, Re-muni Tracker, Lexis-Nexus...

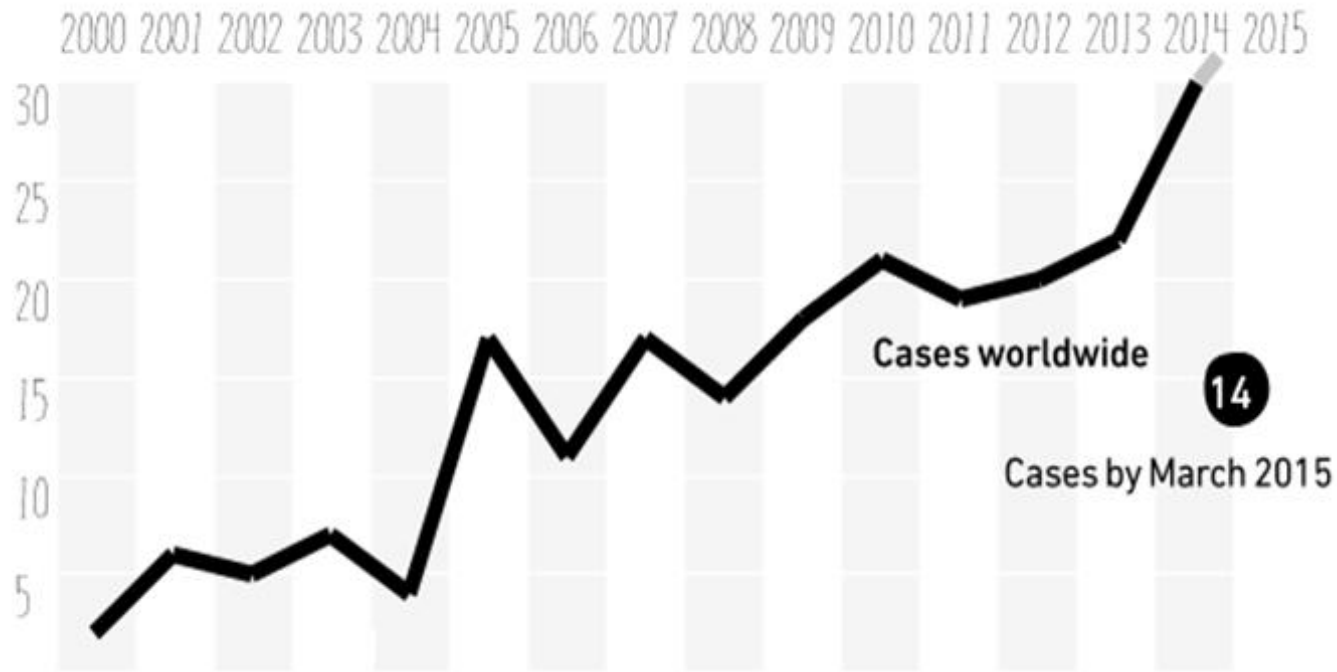


Remunicipalisation as an accelerating global trend (1):

- **2000** – **2 CASES** – less than **1 000 000** people affected
- **2015** – **235 CASES** – more than **100 000 000** people affected
